Chapter Two: Technology



The Western Manitoba Regional Library had a busy 2018, developing new programs for the communities of Westman. From engaging youth in the age of technology to welcoming back patrons who had not used the library in years, 2018 has been a fruitful year. Some of the year's initiatives include:

- Programs like Blind Date with a Book and The Golden Ticket that tempt young and old to borrow books once forgotten
- Technology programs like CoderDojo that introduce children to the new languages of computer coding
- Science Saturdays at the Brandon Library that, in partnership with Brandon University's Let's Talk Science team, introduce children to different areas of science with hands-on activities
- Arts programs including painting, knitting and crafts that showcase the hidden artist in all of us
- Educational programs such as Genealogy Day at the Brandon Library that brought people through the library doors to learn together

The WMRL is working to evolve with the needs of our communities. Our communities have responded with a 3.2% total increase in circulation and a 21% increase in electronic borrowing compared with 2017. On behalf of the Board, I commend all the staff on their hard work and success.
