Facilities

- The partnership with the City of Brandon, Art Gallery of Southwestern Manitoba and Brandon General Museum to create a Cultural Hub continued through the year. Through the summer the partners met to create an Operational Agreement. In the Fall the City of Brandon submitted a grant proposal to the Province of Manitoba to help fund the project and committed to contributing as well.
- The Supervisors and Director all worked on creating a Facility Needs List that outlines facility improvements that will be used as a guide for future improvement projects.
- Updated Signage was purchased and installed at many of our library locations, with plans to complete them all in the next 1-2 years.

Technology

- Smartboards were installed at 4 of our 6 library branches to assist
 programming and provide the ability to take part in meetings
 both in person and virtually.
- Leapstart kits were purchased for every branch in the region providing a tech-based reading tool for pre-school aged children.
- The library switched Computer Reservation Software Providers.
 We are now using a cloud-based system that allows us more ability to make adjustments/changes in-house.

Workforce

- Erika Martin took on the role of Director of Library Services in the Spring.
- Donna Jardine retired from her role as Bookkeeper in June.
- In April Kelci Kyle joined WMRL as our Administrative Assistant and Dorothy Raynor was contracted for Bookkeeping.
- A restructuring of administrative roles resulted in Alex Rogowsky being appointed Manager of Programming and Community Services and Carson Rogers being appointed Manager of Access Services/Downtown Brandon Supervisor. These positions include assuming new tasks and additional responsibilities.
- A newly created Supervisor of Shoppers Mall Branch role was filled by Paige Bender.
- At the end of the year a new Marketing and Communications Coordinator position was approved and filled. The WMRL is excited to have Alix Coucill join the team in early 2023.

Community

- Neepawa participated in a year-long focus on non profit and volunteer organizations. Each month they promoted a new organization.
- Carberry increased visibility in the community by participating in numerous events such as Carberry Homecoming and Moonlight Madness.
- Hartney hosted Arts West Travelling Gallery from June 26th to July 15th.
- Glenboro held a fundraising event in partnership with the Glenboro Cat Rescue raising funds and awareness for the organization.
- Regular story times at both the Brandon locations have been incredibly successful throughout 2022.
- Downtown Brandon Library partnered with Green Acres Community Center in the fall of 2022 bringing a bi-weekly pop-up library to the area. Programs and book checkouts/returns were available.
- Healthy Together Now provided a grant to the Downtown Brandon Library funding the purchase of a new hands-free water fountain/water bottle refill station.

Finance

The WMRL received numerous grants this year, including:

- The Winnipeg Foundation provided funding for additional books and craft supplies for story times at our rural branches.
- The Healthy Together Now Grant was awarded for purchasing a water fountain and bottle filler at the Downtown Library.
- The Carberry and Area Community Foundation provided a Children's Non-Fiction Revitalization grant and a grant for a new bike rack.
- Canada Summer Jobs funding helped employ three youth to facilitate children's literacy programs and the TD Summer Reading Club throughout the region.
- In partnership with the City of Brandon and AGSM, the WMRL applied to ACSC Large Capital Grant for \$5million dollars to put towards renovating the Cultural Hub.
- WMRL submitted applications for the ACSC Small Capital and Special Incentives grants to fund facility improvements.
- Downtown Brandon Library received \$15,000.00 to put towards new shelf ends.
- The Glenboro Library was successful in obtaining a grant from the Glenboro Area Foundation. Phase 2 of 3 of the project was completed.


A small change with a big impact was implemented - late-fees were permanently eliminated in 2022. It's clear that life gets in the way sometimes and returning a book on time isn't always possible.
