

PUBLIC COMPUTER USE	
Purpose	To outline the parameters of behavioral expectations for use of the WMRL's public computers.
Scope	This policy applies to all patrons using WMRL's public computers.
Definitions	Patron: Any user of the WMRL, member or otherwise.
Policy Guidelines	<p>PUBLIC COMPUTER USE:</p> <p>The WMRL is pleased to offer free public computer use. Out of courtesy to all WMRL staff and patrons, please respect the following parameters:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each patron is entitled to one hour (60 minutes) of free computer use daily • Patrons who have active library memberships may log into the public computers using their barcodes and PINs • Patrons who do not have active library memberships may obtain a temporary barcode from a Library staff member. These patrons are still restricted to one hour of computer use per day and must provide their name and a piece of documentation that corroborates their identity in order to gain computer access. This documentation does not need to be government-issued ID <p>BEHAVIOURAL EXPECTATIONS:</p> <p>Disruptive or illicit behaviour is not tolerated on WMRL's public computers, and Library staff members hold the authority to enforce these expectations. Examples of unacceptable behaviour include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listening to music or other audio at a disruptive volume • Multiple patrons gathering around one computer to the detriment of other computer users • Speaking at a disruptive volume, including on the phone • Pursuing any illegal activity • Perusing online or other content that disturbs or insults fellow patrons <p>If the above expectations are not met, Library staff members have the right to ask patrons to stop using the computer, or even to leave the premises. In Brandon, staff members may call upon the support of Paladin Security to enforce this policy.</p>
